Legislator Stephanie Bontempi (R-18th L.D.) visited Our Lady Queen of Martyrs Church in Centerport on Tuesday, October 28th, to deliver a portable Automated External Defibrillator (AED). The device was provided at no cost through an ongoing Suffolk County initiative aimed at enhancing emergency preparedness in houses of worship. This outreach effort, led by the Suffolk County Department of Fire, Rescue and Emergency Services (FRES), provided each County Legislator with one AED to distribute within their district to a house of worship. The program also includes the availability of Narcan kits and Stop the Bleed kits for any house of worship in need.



"I'm happy to be able to provide this lifesaving equipment to Our Lady Queen of Martyrs," said Legislator Bontempi. "It's important that our local houses of worship have the tools they need to respond in an emergency. If there is a house of worship located within Suffolk County Legislative District 18 and is in need of Narcan kits, or Stop the Bleed kits, please contact my office at (631) 854-4500." The following day all staff members were trained by Chris Mahoney, former FDNY/Paramedic current Centerport Fire Department member on how to use the lifesaving AED.
